
Constantine the Great in **Amsterdam**

An exposition of numerous artifacts, treasures and artwork from the era of Constantine the Great is being held in the 'Nieuwe Kerk' in Amsterdam until 7 February.

In the 4th Century A.D. Rome, the capital of the Empire, transformed from a multi religion city littered with temples and colossal statues, to the Christian religious and papal city full of churches with the emblem of the cross. Christianity grew in a short time from a small religious minority to Rome's dominant religion, with a great influence on daily life in the city and the whole Roman world. Even until today! In the first centuries A.D. Rome was a multicultural melting pot of religions; worshipping a variety of deities the most popular being: Isis, Dionysus, Mithras, and Jupiter Dolichenus. Christianity was on the rise! It started as an imported cult, brought to Rome by immigrants from Palestine, gaining more and more followers in the 2nd and 3rd century in the provinces of the empire, especially in the eastern part. In the 4th century in most cities the Christians began to grow into a majority. To the average Roman, the belief in a God that suffered the cruel and shameful death on the cross (crucifixion) must have seemed absurd. The Christian teachings moreover taught 'strange' matters like: 'Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you' (Luke 6:27), 'But many that are first shall be last; and the last first' (Mark 10:31), 'Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth' (Matthew 5:5). This was in fact an inverse of the social fabric of antiquity. Constantine most likely at first directed his prayers to Jupiter and Sol Invictus, after having a vision in 310 A.D. (this most probably was a sun halo).

In 312 A.D. on the evening preceding the battle with Maxentius, Constantine had another vision, in which was revealed that he would prevail if he openly would declare his support to the Christian belief of the unknown god only to be charged with: 'in hoc signo vinces'. He then ordered to surmount his imperial standard with XP and to emblazon the shields of his troops with that same emblem. The next day on 28 October 312 A.D. Constantine did defeat Maxentius in a battle at the Milvian bridge near Rome. Maxentius drowned in the Tiber during that battle... From that day on Constantine openly supported the Christian faith and the growth of its followers, and promulgated the Christianity. effects became very visible in daily life, and in a short span of time monumental churches were built. Constantine now the Augustus, became the patron of Christianity and ruled as the Hand of God, with the sole purpose of uniting the Western and Eastern Empire under one ruler and one religion. In 321 A.D. the first law regarding the Sunday's rest was passed, and defeating his coemperor Licinius in 324 A.D. the Christian revolution accelerated even more. Magnificent churches were built. e.g. Church of the Holy Sepulchre and the Church of Nativity (324-337 A.D.)



And a new morality based on the Christian teachings regarding the poor and decrepit emerged. 324 A.D. marks the founding of Constantinople and in 325 A.D. the first council of Nicea took

place. The subsequent growth of the complex religion Christianity is, was truly miraculous. It literally took centuries to form a widely accepted definition of the tri-une God, the salvation and redemption of man by the death of Christ, and the promise of resurrection. And finally Christianity became a binding element in the social fabric of the pluriformous Roman Empire. The principles of equality of man (disregarding gender, race, and social status) stressing responsibility towards society offered an acceptable alternative to a struggling class driven society. At his deathbed in 337 A.D. Constantine was baptised fully embracing Christianity.

Now we have the opportunity to marvel at a number of treasures from an era that gave us this great legacy. The exhibition in the 'Nieuwe Kerk' a must see!
